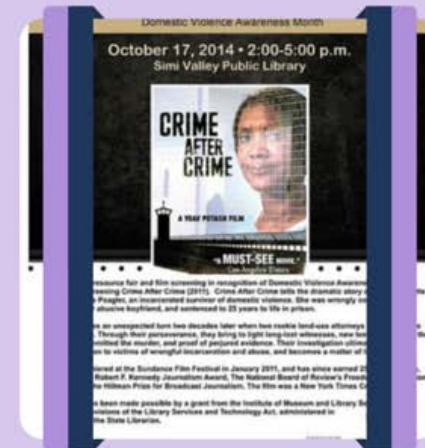

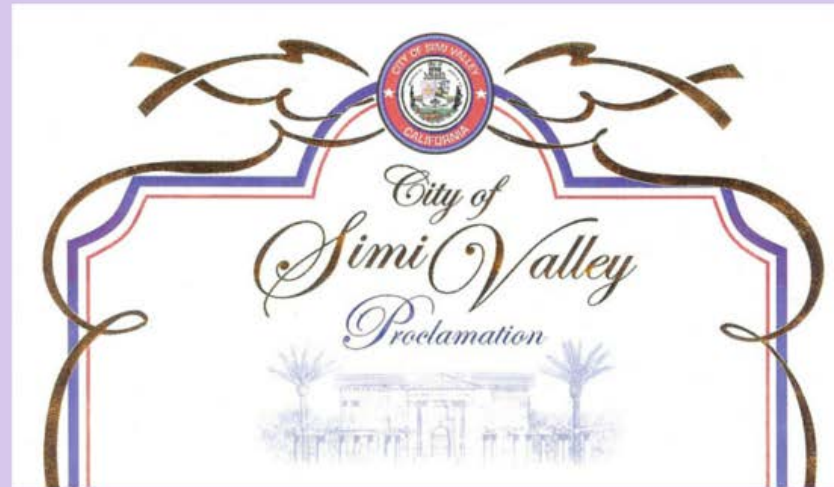

Catherine Duggan is an advocate for victims of violent crime working in the Justice Services unit of the Ventura County District Attorney. In 2009, Ms. Duggan was a recipient of the California Governor's Crime Victim Advocate Award. This prestigious award recognized Ms. Duggan's leadership in advancing the rights of crime victims. In 2010, Ms. Duggan was the recipient of the "Victim Advocate of the Year" award. This award was presented to Ms. Duggan by the California Crime Victims Action Alliance. The Action Alliance is a statewide organization dedicated to enforcing crime victim rights.

Ms. Duggan serves on a number of statewide committees and is the author of numerous professional articles on issues concerning the needs of crime victims.

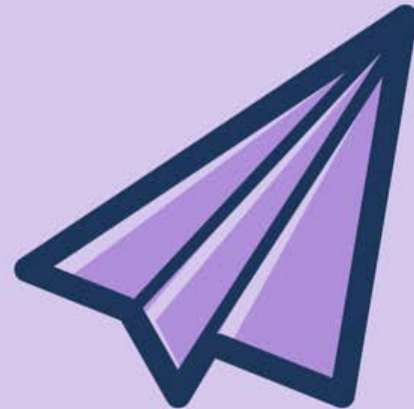
